BRITISH LEAGUE NATIONAL ONE PICKETTS LOCK, ENFIELD – 2/6/07

Windsor Slough Eton & Hounslow Athletic Club shine to finish second in the second of four matches in the British League National One.

On an extremely hot day, WSEH raised the temperatures even higher when they finished second in their British League National One match at Enfield, to leave them sitting in second place and a promotion place in the table with two matches left. The day started well with the undefeated Julian Golley and Mark Holloway winning the Long Jump followed by an equally impressive Tom Reynolds winning the B string Pole Vault. On the track, Ian May, severely hampered by a stomach complaint, broke the English Schools Qualifying time in the 800m to round off a memorable week for the youngster as he also did the same a few days earlier in the 1500m. Having his first race of the season following injury, Rion Pierre ran well to finish 2nd in both the 100m/200m. A feat equalled by Andy Matthews. Paul Couldridge sliced 15 seconds of his PB in the steeplechase while the vastly improving Owain Jones set new personal figures in the 5000m. Newly signed, Jeremy Harper, showed his potential in the field by performing well in the Shot, Discus and Javelin.

Team Manager, Bryan Goodman, singled out two other performances that excited him namely Alan McKie who achieved the qualifying height in the High Jump for the European Junior Championships later in the year and the newly formed Sprint Relay quartet of Rion Pierre, Steve Johnson, Mark Holloway and Andy Matthews who won so impressively.

This exceptional placing left the Windsor Club as strong promotion candidates with the next match being at home on 7th July.
